
NOVEMBER EDU-EVENT: PILGRIMS, PURITANS AND PATRIOTS

What better location than the Sturgis Library in Barnstable to hold a talk about early Massachusetts colonists?

Sturgis is the oldest building that houses a public library in America. Built in 1644 as the home of Rev. John Lothrop (1584-1653) who was among the first settlers of Barnstable. Sturgis is also known as the oldest structure still standing in the US where religious services were regularly held. Lothrop was a proponent of the idea of the separation of church and state, a heretical idea at the time. Lothrop's descendants include six US presidents including Ulysses S. Grant, Franklin D. Roosevelt and both Presidents Bush. Former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney also is a Lothrop descendant.

Boston College Prof. Christopher Hannon will relay stories of the early years of settlement in Massachusetts: from Church of England Separatists who settled in Plymouth to English Puritans who colonized Salem and Boston. These insights will provide you with new tales of Pilgrims and Puritans to share at the Thanksgiving table this November!

The edu-event will be held in early November and a separate email will announce date and time. We hope that many attendees will meet at the Dolphin after the talk for a no host social hour.


A BC PASSING

The BC family notes the passing of Katherine V. (Walsh) Dunford on September 9, 2023. Mrs. Dunford grew up in South Boston and married Marine Joe Dunford in 1954. She was a member of the BC High Mothers' Guild and actively involved in church and Scouting events. Mrs. Dunford was the mother of our own Mike Dunford (BC 1982 and co-chair of BC's Veterans Alumni Network), General Joseph F. Dunford, Jr, USMC Retired and sons Paul and James. Her brother, the Very Reverend Michael P. Walsh, SJ, was President of Boston College from 1958 to 1968 and was considered "the founder of the modern Boston College," raising BC to the level of a nationally prestigious school.
